Booking to use the lake: Our fees for open water swimming, kayaking and sub boarding are for a maximum of 2 consecutive hours of use on your booked date/time. By booking and paying you are considered to have read and accepted the Terms and Conditions as set out below, together with the safety information for Lake users. you must accept the terms of our waiver to use our lake.

Terms & Conditions

- Booking and Payment to use the lake is none refundable. . You will be required to record the details of an emergency contact. All lake users must sign in upon arrival at our main visitor facility and return to our main visitor facility to sign out so we can be sure you have safely vacated the site.
- You may be asked to wear a simple silicone wrist band upon arrival in order for us to make sure the lake as no more than the 50 users at anytime one. This must be returned when you have left the water. It may be collect by a warden at the lakeside during busy periods to better unable other users (not a life guard)
- You must sign out not more than 2.5hrs after sign in.
- If we have to cancel your booking for any reason you will be offered a re-booking
- Personal details will not be kept without express permission

- **Please keep your 2 metres distance at all times and ensure you are following the latest government advice in relation to COVID-19**

- Any person identified to be using the lake without a visible wristband will be asked to leave the lake immediately.

- Dogs must be under close control or on a lead at all times. You are responsible for clearing up after your dog.
- Any none swimming visitors may be subject to an entry charge unless they are you designated spotter which will not be charged.

- Antisocial Behaviour will not be tolerated, nor will we tolerate abuse of our staff in any form. Any person acting in a manner which our staff or other visitors consider to be antisocial behaviour will be asked to leave the site. If a person refuses to leave or is abusive to our staff we will involve the police.

- CCTV is located on site and images captured will be passed to the Police where it contains evidence of a crime or of antisocial behaviour. Where a person refuses to leave site photographs or videos may be taken and used as evidence for the Police or published on Social Media in order to identify the individuals in question.

Open Water Swimming - Instructions for your safety

- You must have a tow float to swim at Park in the PAST. You can hire one from the Park upon arrival based on availability. Your swim may be delayed for this to function so purchasing your own is highly recommended.
- Acclimatise to cold water gradually. Don't push your time in cold water if you're unused to it and always take warm clothes to put on afterwards (even in summer - it's amazing how fast you get cold). You will feel colder when you get out.

- Lone swimming is not permitted. You should ensure you have at least someone watching you from the side of the lake. Park in the Past Lake staff are not available to be used for this purpose.

- Do not swim if you have any open cuts or grazes and try not to go under or swallow the water.

- Children aged 14-16 years must be supervised by an adult over the age of 18 years (evidence of age may be requested), and children under 14 must have an adult swimming with them in the water.

- No diving. There may be objects under the water that you cannot see.

- Be aware of your swimming capabilities.

- You must keep all valuables with you at all times. We do not have storage facilities. Park in the Past accepts no responsibility for loss of any possessions.
- Any vehicle or personal belongings are your own responsibility and Park in the Past accepts no claim against for such.

- Ensure you keep at least a 2m distance at all times when swimming and be aware of your surroundings
- Parts off our lake are an ecological zone and often segregated from water use. this is in the form of a TOW LINE WHICH MUST NOT BE CROSSED.
- Water use entry is only available from the southern half of the lake identified by having Container storage in place.
